- Conducting welfare checks on patients
- Responding to older patients whom have experienced a fall at home
- Supporting the discharge of patients from acute hospitals

Each of these activities contributes enormously to our overall response to meet the needs of our patients. In this context, we wanted to say a sincere thank you to all of our staff, supervisors and managers and in particular, all of the many volunteers for everything you have and are continuing to do for our patients.
